Cardinal Clinic provides professional mental health and substance abuse services to children, adolescents, adults and families. Services are provided by a multidisciplinary team of professional psychologists, psychiatrists, clinical social workers, family therapists, professional counselors and paraprofessional mental health technicians. Outpatient services include individual therapy, group therapy, family therapy, marital/couples therapy, parent training, substance abuse treatment, psychological testing, psychiatric evaluations and medication management. Cardinal Clinic also provides Client Behavior Intervention (CBI) and High Risk Intervention (HRI) services for Medicaid-eligible clients, school-based counseling and a continuum of 24-hour residential services for children and adolescents.

Responsibilities: Program planning, development, implementation and evaluation; fiscal planning and management; clinical and administrative supervision of outpatient programs and staff; direct provision of outpatient therapy and assessment; manage and provide specialized services to law enforcement agencies; manage and provide consultation services to companies and agencies.

Under direction of the Program Director, provided administration and supervision for non-medical clinical services of the Fort Bragg Demonstration Project, including Outpatient Services, Intake/Emergency Services, Home-Based Services, Day Treatment, and Residential Services. This program provided a full continuum of mental health and substance abuse services for the 46,000 military dependent children, adolescents and their families who resided within forty miles of Fort Bragg, N.C.

Directed and provided psychological services on the 32-bed Adolescent Unit. Supervised one senior psychologist and two staff psychologists.
